



Certification of Urgent or Emergency Medical Procedure

Governor Ron DeSantis' Executive Order 20-72, following the recommendations of the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services and other organizations, prohibits all non-urgent or non-emergency medical and surgical procedures during the declared State of Emergency issued on March 9, 2020. Accordingly, until the expiration of the State of Emergency or until Executive Order 20-72 is rescinded, all medical and surgical procedures will require a certification from the physician performing the procedure attesting that the performance of such procedure conforms with the restrictions imposed under Executive Order 20-72.

- After a consultation with the patient, based on the patient's current medical condition, it is my informed medical opinion that postponing the proposed procedure for this patient will place the patient's immediate health, safety or well-being at risk or will contribute to the worsening of a serious or life-threatening medical condition. I am aware of the current restrictions imposed by Executive Order 20-72 and certify that the performance of the proposed procedure for the patient listed below is in conformance therewith.
